Phased plan to make Cardiff one of UK's 'safest' cities launched

Shoppers, workers and residents visiting Cardiff city centre will now be greeted by staffed welcome points, safe walking systems and some road closures as the city launches stage one of its phased plan to safeguard the public as COVID-19 lockdown restrictions begin to lift.

Cardiff Council immediately implemented its plan, which came into effect on 22 June, to keep people safe and help businesses to reopen, including:

- setting up staffed welcome and information points
- creating a clearly signed walking system – accessible to all

- establishing queuing areas outside shops
- leaving available bench spaces where people can stop to rest
- closing Castle Street and Mill Lane to traffic
- help and advice for people with disabilities, including a motorised buggy pick-up service.

The new measures are part one of a number of actions the council will bring in over time as more and more restrictions are lifted.

Lisvane Players in lockdown

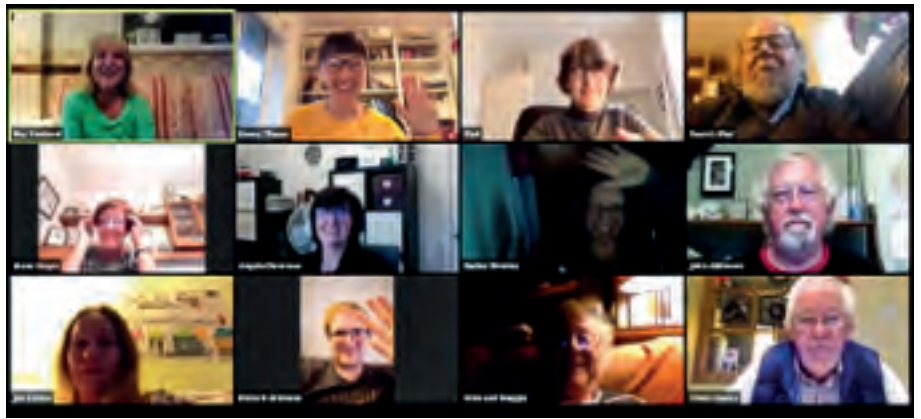
We may not be able to meet in the Memorial Hall at the moment, but we are having our regular Thursday Drama Nights via Zoom!

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Cardiff's plans to exit lockdown

The council is working on plans for the stage when the city exits lockdown. The plans contain a number of ideas that are described as innovative, which aim to help local people and businesses return to 'normal'. It also aims to re-establish the former footfall in the city centre, while accepting that public transport will take some time to return to its own 'normal'.

When the plans were published the media headline became the idea to open up Cardiff Castle's grounds to create a new public square for use by businesses.

A summary of the key proposals includes:

- Welcome points at the main pedestrian access points to offer advice to the visitor on how to move around in a safe way and reach their chosen destinations.
- One-way pedestrian movement will help visitors and workers to follow one-way marked routes that allow social distancing.
- Queues, retail units and arcades will restrict the number of users at any one time. There will be queuing on streets as we have recently witnessed in TV news reports.
- Restaurant and pub spill-out areas. New spaces in the public realm will allow food outlets, cafés and bars to allow social distancing in pleasant public spaces. This will include the grounds of the castle inside and around the main walls.
- Accessing the city centre. A new transport plan will put the city centre into 'event mode' and may lead to road closures to allow space to be used more efficiently.
- Homelessness and aggressive begging. A long-term strategy for the homeless is being developed. An effort will be made to discourage around 30 rough sleepers from returning to the streets and to the begging on which

Lisvane issues

The return to work has led to the restart of a number of road schemes in Lisvane. Cherry Orchard Road near the station is now completed and work in Ridgeway is about to start as I write in mid-June.

I have asked for resurfacing at Cherry Tree Close and the footway at Mill Place, both of which will receive treatment this year.

Work near the Redrow site on Llwynypia Road will have restarted with traffic lights in operation. Through traffic is advised to bypass this area while work is in progress up to the end of September.

At Parc Cefn Onn work progresses and recently we have seen a dramatic increase in visitors, some more sensitive to social distancing than others.

The overflow of cars from the park should reduce when the full parking capacity returns to normal in late summer.

they depend for funding drug habits. During lockdown these people have been helped to tackle addictions and many have begun treatment. Members of the public are being informed about the use to which money from begging is used and the harm that it can cause, sometimes leading to fatalities. Rough sleeping in the centre has already reduced following lockdown but could return to former levels. We must remain hopeful that the benefits and treatments described can be maintained.

- Local centres to reopen. Local safety schemes that include pavement widening, cycle routes and 20mph zones are being piloted. Measures in progress on Wellfield Road could be

rolled out elsewhere. The aim is to help local businesses and shoppers by creating an environment that favours them above the car.

We must hope that these measures help to get the city back to its former state and that none of the 45,000 jobs in the city centre become at risk. A 20% drop in economic performance could see the loss of 10,000 of these jobs. Winning back the confidence of local people and visitors is vital for future sustainability. We are all encouraged to return to our former habit of enjoying one of the best city centres in the UK.

Cardiff City region boost

The city region concept was set up nationally several years ago to provide funding and support for regions outside London and the South East.

The Capital City region focuses on Cardiff and South East Wales and is run by a cabinet consisting of 10 council leaders from this region. It is able to invest £1.2bn into the local economy. Just over half of this sum is being invested in the South Wales Metro transport scheme.

A recently announced project proposes a life sciences innovation park with space for up to 2,000 jobs at Coryton, near Whitchurch. This life sciences park aims to provide 225,000 square feet of office and research space.

The cabinet also decided to invest £4m in an artificial intelligence company working on the analysis of healthcare data leading to full scientific studies.

This company will aim to employ a large number of local graduates in highly skilled and highly paid jobs.

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COVID-19: some constituents' questions answered

As I write this column, we are still living in strange times. Many people are finding it hard to bear this unfamiliar way of life and the realisation that social distancing, in some form, is likely to be in place for a long time.

Others are incredibly worried about their jobs and their futures. This uncertainty and stress is affecting people of all ages and from all walks of life.

Last month we marked Loneliness Awareness Week, and in my role as Deputy Minister for Health and Social Services I have been urging everyone to do what they can to combat this – by picking up the phone, making contact via social media or video calling, if possible. Many people have joined local volunteering groups during this crisis and this, too, can help combat loneliness.

Some of us are lucky to have family living nearby, others are not so fortunate – such is the reality of living in modern Wales. But we must remember that coronavirus has not gone away and it is a 'silent spreader'. So, by not travelling widely, we have all been helping to reduce the risk of people carrying the virus from community to community.

I would like to remind everyone reading this that tests and treatment for cancer are still available, even though services have been adapted as a result of the coronavirus outbreak.

People with possible cancer symptoms are being urged not to put off getting them checked out. Public Health Wales has said it plans to resume cancer screening programmes, beginning with cervical screening this month.

It will also be sending out invitations and reminders to people eligible for

breast and bowel cancer screening away from the main hospitals.

Six frequently asked questions by constituents

Many people have been in touch with me about issues to do with coronavirus and my staff have dealt with 375 cases to date.

You can get in touch with me by email or by leaving a phone message (my contact details are on the following page). I am able to speak to constituents on the phone or via Zoom by appointment.

What's happening with schools in Wales?

The Education Minister Kirsty Williams announced plans for schools to reopen to all children in Wales on 29 June (at the time of writing), subject to the latest data and medical advice. If this changes, or the R rate or hospital admissions increase, then the decision to reopen to all pupils will be reconsidered.

The aim is to give all Welsh pupils a four-week period in which to check in, catch up and prepare for a 'new normal'. Only a third of pupils at most will be in school at any one time, so it's likely that they'll only be in school for a small amount of their normal timetable – but they will have much-needed contact time with their teachers before the summer holidays. Without it, most pupils would face six months or more out of the classroom.

I recognise that some teachers, learners and their parents or guardians are apprehensive about this decision and that this is a challenging time for all involved.

In striking a balance between public health considerations and the risk of

long-term damage to the life chances of our young people, I believe that the Welsh Government is doing the right thing and is acting in the interests of the next generation.

Are free school meals being provided over the summer in Wales?

Yes. Wales was the first country in the UK to guarantee ongoing funding for children to continue to receive free school meals throughout the summer holidays during the coronavirus pandemic.

With the support of the Welsh Local Government Association, the Welsh Government is making £33m available to help local authorities continue to provide free school meals.

I welcome the fact that, following a high-profile campaign by footballer Marcus Rashford, the UK Government has now decided to fund free school meals for 1.3 million children in England over the summer holidays too.

What about the economy and jobs?

Action to help people who will be hardest hit by the economic impact of coronavirus will be vital for Wales' recovery.

Although the situation in June shows that employment levels have been maintained in Wales at 74.4% over the past three months, it is thought these will deteriorate as the UK Government's wage support schemes come to an end in the autumn.

The Welsh Government is developing a comprehensive employability and skills support package to allow people to upskill and find new employment.

Nearly £1bn worth of support has been allocated so far to firms in Wales, with more to come when the Wales-only £500m Economic Resilience Fund was due to be reopened for further applications.

Who will receive a social care workforce payment?

I am proud that we have funded a £500 extra payment for all social care workers in Wales to show that the invaluable work they do is appreciated.

This is a special, one-off payment for all care home and domiciliary care workers. It will be paid to all ancillary staff working in residential homes, including kitchen staff for example.

What if my pet is unwell?

Veterinary practices are keen to reassure the public that they are still open and can offer help across all areas of their work. However, please bear in mind that practice opening hours may vary and so will the services on offer (to comply with social distancing regulations).

If your pet is sick, vets want to hear from you and can help with consultations (these may be remote) and dispensing medicines.

Check your practice website for how to make contact.

Should I wear a facemask?

I know many people are choosing to wear masks (technically, these tend to

be 'face coverings') when out buying food, for example, but there is generally little clear evidence pointing one way or another about the benefits of mask wearing.

Social distancing and hygiene measures are by far the most effective ways to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.

The advice in Wales is different to England. Here, it is the public's right to choose, with some exceptions – for example, if you're on the shielded list and need to attend an outpatients' appointment.

Face coverings are not required to be worn by visitors to care homes, when visits are outdoors and social distancing is maintained.
